

Earlier in the year we announced:

As part of Scotland's Year of History, Heritage and Archaeology, the Ross of Mull Historical Centre (ROMHC)was delighted to receive an award of £9200 from Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF). An exciting project, Focus on Ardchiavaig, aims to bring to life the heritage of the now deserted rural township of Ardchaivaig on the Isle of Mull. The HLF grant will used to carry out an archaeological survey and make a digital documentary of the process.

The combined results of the survey, the study of the natural environment, ROMHC archives and reminiscences by descendants of Ardchiavaig families will provide more detailed information on the past. Digital recording and editing of the survey will create a range of materials and formats to exhibit at the Historical Centre. Many of these activities will be used for training our archivists and young people in the application of digital recording and presentation. A series of events will be open to all members of the local community and visitors. The National Trust for Scotland's Ranger Service will conduct three guided walks over the area, discussing the geology, flora and fauna. A local Gaelic scholar will assist us to investigate and interpret the place-names which describe the topography and activities carried out there. Volunteers from the Historical Centre will coordinate and manage the activities and events throughout the project, culminating in a final exhibition. (Now read on...)



In August we were able to give this update:

Ardchiavaig lives!

In the last few months this beautiful but apparently empty corner of Mull, near Uisken on the Ross, has become better known to many people. Though the houses of the township have long been ruined, family names and connections are remembered, and – as a series of walks this summer showed – flora and fauna flourish there. Local people and visitors to the island enjoyed three guided walks, in June, July and August, at Ardchiavaig with Ranger Emily Wilkins and ecologist Sue Clare. The first focused on Gaelic Place names, with the help of Gaelic scholar Jane Brunton. A walk-through archaeology survey by Dr Clare Ellis of Argyll Archaeology in July, funded by the Heritage Lottery Fund, has produced a detailed report, now being studied by volunteers at the Ross of Mull Historical Centre, which commissioned it.

During the week she gave on-site training in surveying techniques. Alasdair Satchel, a professional film-maker from north Mull, recorded the events on film and ran a workshop aimed at aspiring young film-makers.
